





Asiyah's favorite family recipe: her grandma's curry chicken and rice!

- 1-1/4 pounds boneless, skinless chicken breasts cut into 1/4-inch strips
- Salt and freshly ground black pepper
- 2-1/2 teaspoons curry powder
- · 3 tablespoons olive oil
- 1 medium yellow onion finely chopped
- 4 garlic cloves minced
- 1 tablespoon grated fresh ginger
- 1 green bell pepper finely chopped 1/4 cup plain low fat (2%) or whole Greek yogurt (do not use nonfat)
- 1/4 cup chopped fresh cilantro
- · 4 cups of basmati white rice

- Offered financial aid workshops in English, Spanish and Vietnamese to 139 participants






ETHNICITY

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
